



THE MACKENZIE STUDY

The overarching goal of The Mackenzie Study is to build a rigorous evidence base documenting within-person gains in entrepreneurial skills (using before-after surveys for individual cohort members) attributable to participation in the Kellogg or Nuffield programmes.

With the Nuffield Study complete and the Kellogg Study well under way, we have drawn on this data to provide a brief impact summary below.

Rural Scholarship - Creating Impact in 2021/2022



PG Cert accreditation - In 2021 it became possible to concurrently achieve a Kellogg qualification and a PG Cert in Commerce from Lincoln University.

Both Massey and Lincoln also offer recognised prior learning (RPL) in the form of 60 credits towards a post grad. qualification e.g., PG Dip. or Masters degree.

63 Scholars have volunteered to take up PG Cert alongside their Kellogg study. This is an outcome of the Pāhautea Initiative, announced in late 2020 between Lincoln University, Massey University, the Agricultural and Marketing Research and Development Trust (AGMARDT) and Rural Leaders.
